Transfer and Articulation

- Washington ranks 1st in the nation for the average rate by which a community college student transfers to a four-year institution earns a bachelor's degree within six years of entering higher education.
- Washington ranks 5th in the nation for the average rate by which a community college transfer student earns a credential before transferring to a four-year institution.

Next Steps

- Engaged with the WA Workforce Education & Coordinating Board around work-based learning.
- Several Legislative Work Groups: Accelerated Degree Programs, Sexual Assault Prevention, Behavioral Health & Suicide Prevention, Students with Disabilities, Student Loan Debt.
- Institutions are in the process of developing reverse articulation agreements as required by Senate Bill 6354.
- Drafting sector common language with regard to Cambridge credits, updating AP and IB institutional equivalencies.
- Working with partners to: (1) Update transfer publications, (2) Begin discussions with regard to DTA-Business and DTA-Pre-Nursing/Nursing, (3) Implementation of new CHS rules, and (4) Mathways Project.

Statewide Attainment Goals for 2023


Proposed in the 2013 Roadmap and adopted by the 2014 Legislature. All adults ages 25–44 in Washington will have a high school diploma or equivalent.



Five Year Enrollment 2010-2015


- Enrollment decreasing overall


