Executive Summary:

ICRC Spring 2025 Meeting (April 10-11, 2025)

The Intercollege Relations Commission (ICRC) held its Spring 2025 meeting in Spokane at SFCC on April 10-11, 2025, with representatives from approximately twenty-five Washington higher education institutions and multiple agencies in attendance. Key highlights included:

Financial Status

- ICRC Account balance as of March 31, 2025: \$5,821.86
- Spring 2025 meeting expenses: \$1,948.80
- New dues structure approved: \$150 annually for institutional members (two attendees each), \$50 annually for agency members

Leadership Updates

- Appreciation shared for Dave Sundine's time on the executive board
- Axi Bontrager (City University) elected as the ICRC Member at Large
- Austin Colburn (South Seattle) joined the OAR Committee
- Melissa Sitzenstock concluding role as OAR Committee chair, with Amber Brock (Tacoma CC) assuming committee leadership

Major Discussion Topics

1. Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) Reform

ATC Considering the following for vote on May 2nd:

- o Should the DTA be amended or revised? If amended/revised, should it include:
- Reduced distribution area requirements (Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences)
 from 15 to 10 credits each
- o Reallocation of removed credits to General Electives
- o Include a diversity requirement (collection of institutional requirements underway)
- Limitations on variations of local requirements

Discussion:

- Process and Timeline if DTA revision is supported at ATC's May 2 meeting (Handout)
- Concerns about faculty representation in decision-making process
- o Mixed feedback on impacts to institutional identity and student transfer pathways
- o Request for data on transfer without a degree, excess credits
- ATC feedback to investigate performance courses in the Humanities distribution and alternative courses that might fulfill QSR requirements. Consider impacts to Running Start,

'Frankenstein degrees', transfer ready vs. major ready, and limited electives at the BI's under current DTA structure.

- Discussion on acceptance of online lab sciences
- o Clarification on ENGL& 235 and other English composition transfers
- o Questions about "shelf-life" for specific courses (Math, Computer Science)
- Credit for Prior Learning transcript clarity
