

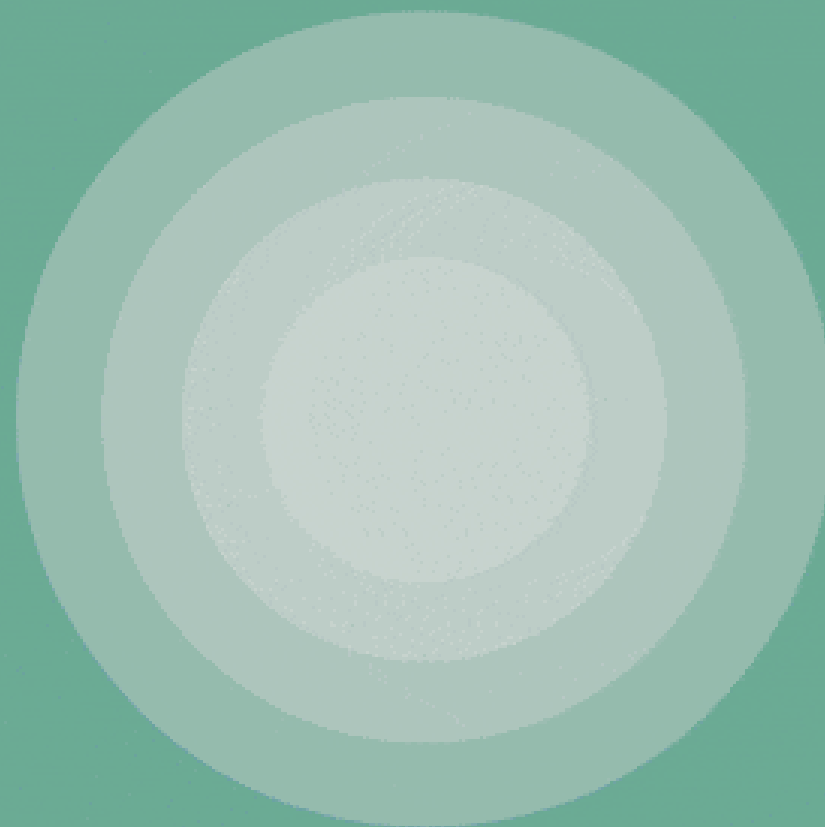

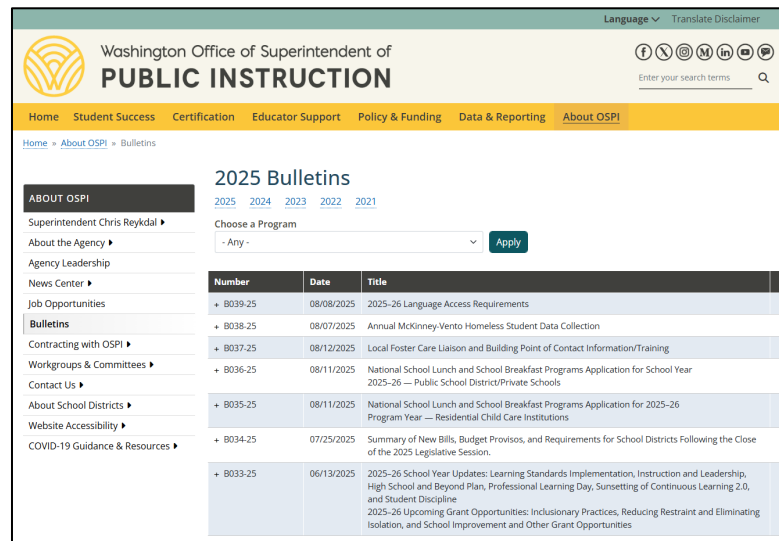

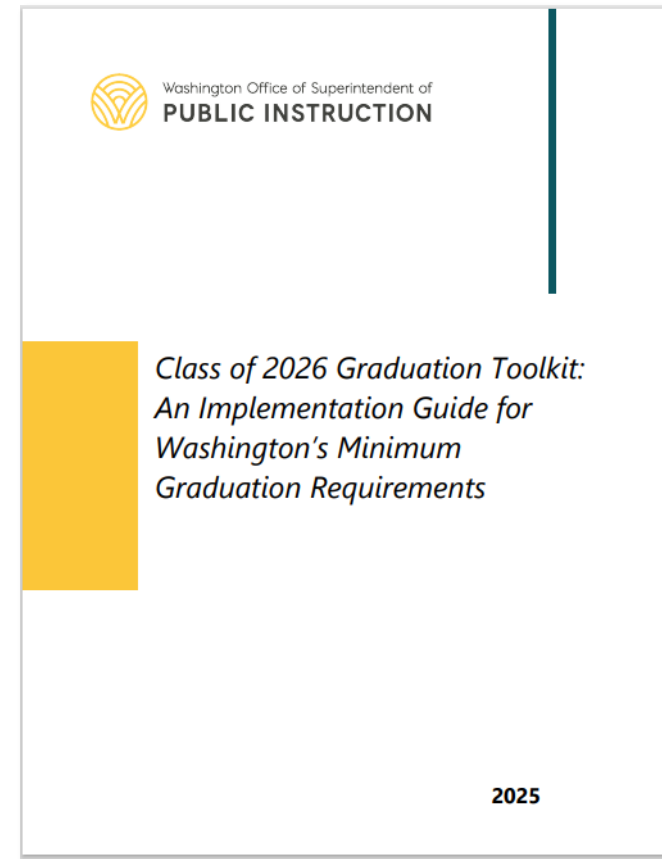

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

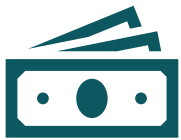
This document provides updates on recent policy, funding and rule changes, and programmatic guidance. The intention is to summarize recent legislative changes and consolidate previously communicated agency guidance made available through other publications. The document includes information on the suspension of dual credit grants and subsidies, Running Start rulemaking pertaining to eligibility and reporting requirements, guidance on supporting High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP) completion for Running Start students, additional guidance on credit conversion for college-level coursework, and a reminder of annual dual credit notification requirements and available resources. Additionally, OSPI has identified technical assistance and professional learning opportunities to aid in the implementation of these programs.

Suspension of Dual Credit Exam Fee Subsidies and the Consolidated Equity and Sustainability Grant (FP 154)

As highlighted in Superintendent Reykdal's [April 28 press release](#), the Legislature's recent budget made some important investments while ensuring maintenance-level funding in K-12 education. In reconciling a four-year, \$12 billion state budget shortfall, over \$135 million in agency funding was eliminated or reallocated for the 2025-2027 biennium.

Exam Fee Subsidy & CES Grant Suspension

What Happened?



\$4.89M dual credit proviso cut in 2025 legislative session.



Exam fee subsidies and CES grant funds (FP 154) suspended for 2025-27.

Possible Resources to Support Student Access to Dual Credit Exams

The College Board offers reduced fees for qualifying low-income students' AP exams.

Title IV funds could be used.

Local district education foundation.

Optional Steps: Districts may share impact data with OSPI and/or advocate independently for resources.

Running Start Rule Changes and Guidance

Emergency Rules

Students receiving Special Education services may continue RS through the year in which they turn **22**.

RS count days in the first month of each college term will be the 4th college day of the month.

- Colleges may submit estimates that must be revised before the next count.

Summer RS Guidance:

- Graduating seniors may *postpone OFFICIAL graduation* to participate (10 credits MAX).
- Schools and districts must establish and communicate a process for students to enroll or get forms signed after buildings close.

FRPL-Eligibility Guidance:

- Schools are encouraged to *advocate for school counselor access to FRPL eligibility*.
- When not permitted, districts are required by [RCW 28A.600.310](#) to share low-income status with colleges directly.

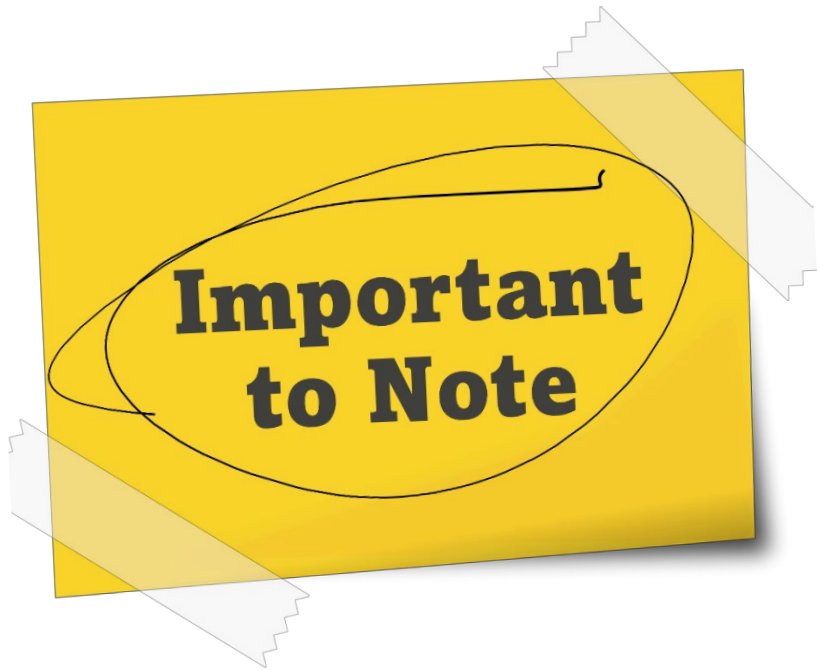
- [WAC 180-51-050](#): 5 quarter/3 semester college credits = 1.0 HS credits
- Equitable application to RS, CiHS, and CTE Dual Credit
- Equitable application to all students in dual credit courses

Dual Credit Notification

Annual Dual Credit Notification

- Notification provided annually by all schools serving grades 9-12
 - Available DC programs
 - Financial assistance
 - Email and other methods (e.g. HSBP)
 - Prior to next year's registration
 - Translated and ADA accessible

Running Start & HSBP Completion



- There is flexibility for seniors ONLY in the *first year* of transition to SchoolLinks
- College Career & College Success (CCS) courses **can support** completion of some HSBP activities, but *no longer 'counts' as meeting HSBP requirement*
- SchoolLinks tasks are required for juniors

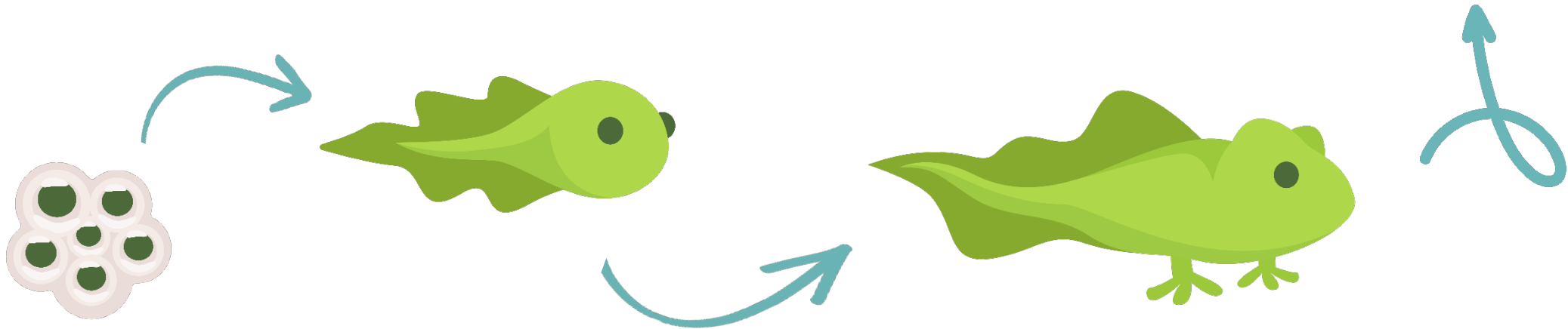
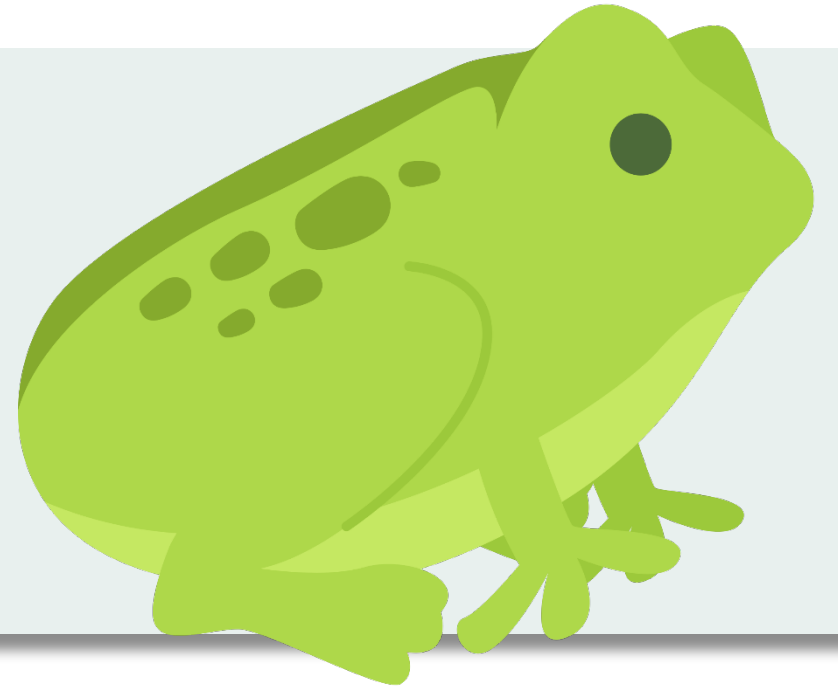

What is a Pulse Check?

OSPI staff will ***review completion data of 3 key HSBP S&S activities on the dates listed below.*** Each date (see sidebar) corresponds to an element of the HSBP process that *needs to happen in a timely manner to maximize benefits for students and provide staff enough time to intervene with those who get behind.*

What happens if we haven't completed the activity?

If progress hasn't yet started by these dates, *we'll follow up with you* to better understand your district's needs and ***how we can best partner with you to support the transition to SchoolLinks.***

These "pulse checks" on HSBP implementation are one of the ways that having a universal platform enables OSPI to provide better support!

September 30th **Onboarding Done**

Ensure students are logged in and complete the onboarding activity.

November 1st **SMART Goals Set**

Support students in setting or updating their academic and career goals for the year.

May 1st **HSBP Submitted**

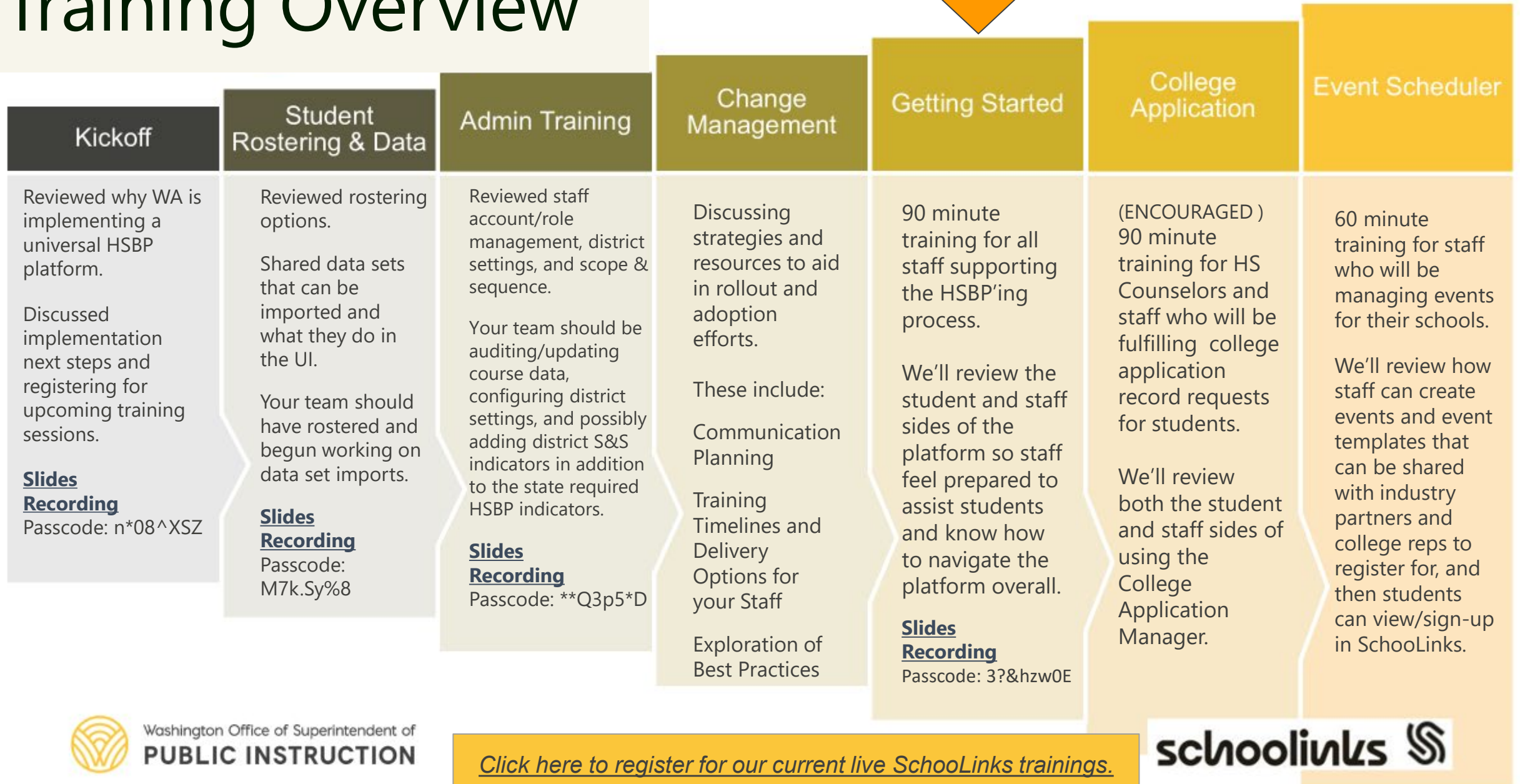
Students submit required HSBP elements; staff can intervene before summer.

We know that **different class schedules** across districts and schools may **result in a needed change in practice to align with the pulse check dates.** This will be a new process for all of us with lots of grace during the transition!

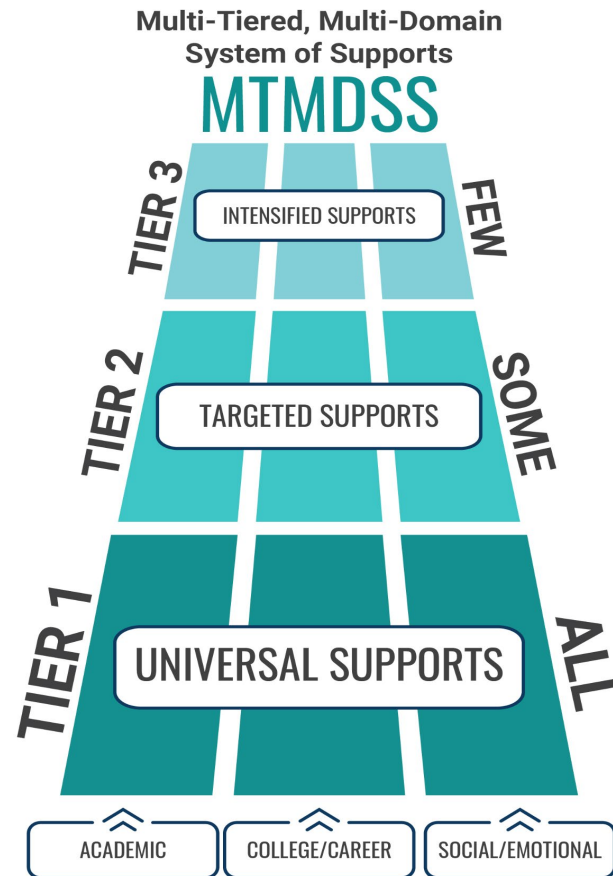

Navigating Future Planning with Compassion in Uncertain Times



Recognize that students and families are experiencing fear, uncertainty, and disruption

Acknowledge that invisible burdens can deeply impact students' ability to engage in future planning or discussions

Create a safe space for students and families to feel seen and supported

Build trusting relationships by considering the unique needs of immigrant and mixed-status families

Be aware of the state, district, and building policies and practices

Consider alternatives or adaptations to programming

Empower student voice and agency to express their concerns and dreams even when the path forward feels uncertain

HSBP Support PD

- Blending CSCP training + HSBP
- Gather data and feedback from 3 "Pulse Checks"
- Create connection and learning spaces based on identified needs

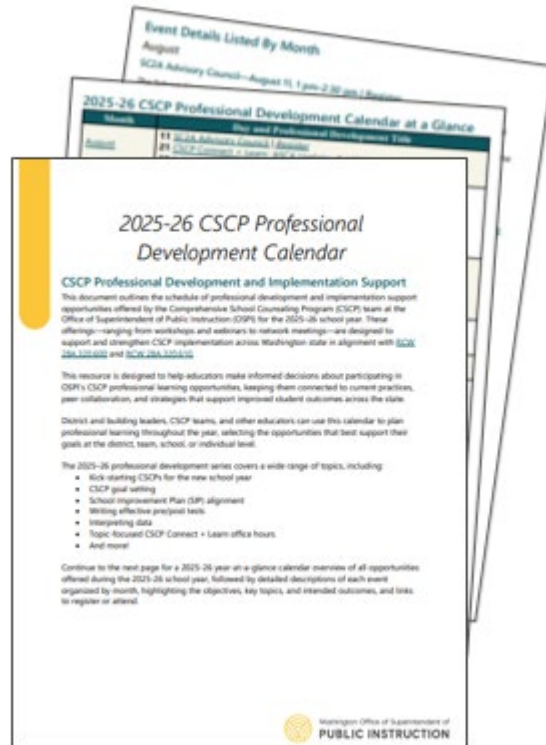
