





#### Washington College Grant



Washington State has made a groundbreaking commitment to financial aid for low- and middle-income people of all ages with the **Washington College Grant** (WA Grant). This grant gives eligible people more money for more types of education like certificate programs, job training, apprenticeships, or college.



#### Washington College Grant Provides a Unique Opportunity

With the Washington College Grant (WCG), more families are eligible for financial aid than ever before.



## College Bound Commitment Eligibility and Auto-Enrollment: A Two-Step Process

### Step One



- Auto-enrollment for eligible public-school students.
- Eligible for FRPL in 7th, 8th, or newly eligible in 9th grade.
- Foster Youth are autoenrolled through HS graduation.

#### Step Two

- Fulfill the College Bound Program Requirements.
- Meet income and residency requirements.
- Be accepted to and attend an eligible college within one year of graduation.
- College Bound award usage is limited to six years following initial enrollment/receipt.



#### College Bound Program



**Combines** with other state financial aid to cover the average cost of tuition (at public rates), some fees, and a small book allowance = **commitment**.



Can be used at about 60 two and four-year public and private colleges and universities.

Class of 2026 will complete the 2026-27 FAFSA or WASFA using 2024 income information

2025-26 FAFSA and WASFA opened in December 2024

Class of 2025 will complete the 2025-26 FAFSA or WASFA using 2023 income information





The 2025-26 FAFSA/WASFA Closes on June 30, 2026



### 2025-26 Financial Aid Update

Federal Student Aid is currently on its second and final wave of beta testing for the 26-27 FAFSA.

Students can sign up now to participate in beta II or wait until October 1st to start applying.

Students participating in beta II can complete a 26-27 FAFSA that will be processed like a regular FAFSA.

#### 2026-27 FAFSA Early Access Participation

You can now sign up to participate in the beta for the 2026-27 FAFSA form. We will approve requests for access depending on testing needs.

FSA ID now called StudentAid.gov account




## Federal Financial Aid Updates (Real-time identity verification)

There is no longer a one-to-three day waiting period to verify a StudentAid.gov (FSA ID).

Beginning in August, all users who create a StudentAid.gov account with a Social Security number will have their accounts verified immediately.

Users who do not have a SSN will continue to follow last year's process.



## Contributor Invitation Process Updated (2026-27 FAFSA)


- Contributors will be invited after the student or parent completes their section, but before signing
- Only an email address will be required to invite a contributor
- The system will generate an invitation code for contributors to use when joining via StudentAid.gov

## Federal Financial Aid Updates (Contributor Invitation Process)



Beginning with the 2026–27 award year the following from current net worth of business and farms and **should not** be reported as assets on the FAFSA form:

- The net worth of a **family-owned business** with 100 or fewer full-time (or full-time equivalent) employees.
- The net worth of a farms on which the family resides.
- The net worth of a commercial fishing business and related expenses, owned and controlled by a family.

The 12th Year Campaign boosts college and financial aid application rates in Washington by helping those working with high school seniors and their families complete applications for college admissions and financial aid.



- Educating the public about the rights and responsibilities of student loan borrowers.




