First-Year Student Admission

- 2.0 or higher cumulative, unweighted GPA
- Completion of coursework for college (CADRs)
- Meeting minimum admission requirements above does not guarantee admissions
- Multiple Paths
 - Path 1: General Admissions
 - Path 2: Guaranteed Admissions



Tips for Success

- Math and English coursework is critical to admissions
- Students are encouraged to take math all four-years of high school
- Finish senior year academically strong




Alternative Admissions

- Students that do not meet
 First-Year Student Admission
 Standards may be admitted
 through alternative
 admissions
- Students are strongly encouraged to complete English and Math coursework
- Do not qualify for **WAGAP**

College Academic Distribution Requirements (CADRs)

- Minimum number of high school course credits required in six subject areas.
- These requirements apply to admissions at Washington public, four-year institutions.
- First-Year Students
 - · Earn a high school diploma or equivalent, and
 - Enroll in college with fewer than 40 quarter/26 semester credits of college-level coursework, or
 - Enroll in college with 40 or more quarter/26 or more semester hours of college-level credit or an associates degree and enter a public baccalaureate institution directly from high school.



CADRs Crosswalks: Moving from Title to Curriculum

- In 2025-26 Washington's public universities will develop course crosswalks to CADRs
- Crosswalk to OSPI state course codes (CEDAR File Appendix V)
- Move away from CADRs based on course number and title
- Move towards CADRs based on curriculum and standards


CADR	CADR Credit	State Course Code	Course Title	Description
English	3 credits of Literature and Composition	01006	AP English Literature and Composition	Following the College Board's suggested curriculum designed to parallel college-level English courses, AP English Literature and Composition courses enable students to develop critical standards for evaluating literature . Students study the language, character, action, and theme in works of recognized literary merit; enrich their understanding of connotation, metaphor, irony, syntax, and tone; and write compositions of their own (including literary analysis, exposition, argument, narrative, and creative writing).
English	1 elective credit	25004	AP Research	Designed by the College Board to parallel college-level courses in independent research, AP Research courses provide students with the opportunity to conduct an in-depth, mentored research project. Course topics include research methods, ethical research practices, and accessing, analyzing, and synthesizing information to address a research question. Courses culminate with an academic thesis paper and an oral defense of the research design, approach, and findings.

Two Equal Paths to Admissions

General Admissions	Washington Guaranteed Admissions Program (WAGAP)
Complete application and send transcripts	Cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale
Admissions offices review high school and college grades, coursework, senior year courses, personal achievements and characteristics	Complete a series of required high school classes
All Washington public baccalaureate institutions	Students who meet the criteria above receive guaranteed admissions to WAGAP-participating institutions : Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, The Evergreen State College, University of Washington Tacoma, Washington State University and Western Washington University
	Complete application and final transcripts

How to Get In

- Total applications are increasing.
- Though admissions have become more competitive generally the odds are in student's favor.
- Washington's public universities are more accessible compared to peer institutions.
